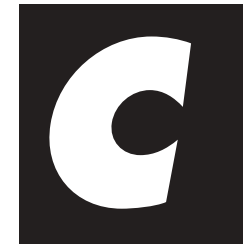

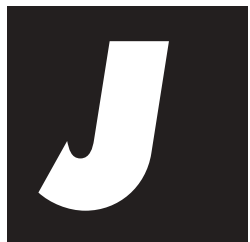

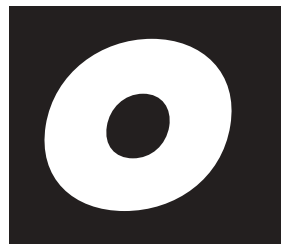

Health Care Proxy Information:

The New York State Health Care Proxy Law allows an individual to appoint someone he or she trusts – for example, a family member or close friend – to make decisions about medical care if the individual is unable to do so. The person appointed must agree to act as a health care agent and should be willing and able to follow instructions on critical medical issues such as use of ventilators and orders not to resuscitate. An individual may also execute a New York Living Will, which sets forth his or her desires as to medical treatment and can be used in support of the Health Care Proxy.

Health Care Proxy Forms and Living Wills are available from the Social Work Services Department of Lawrence Hospital Center, 55 Palmer Avenue, Bronxville, NY 10708, telephone 787-3095.

Once the form has been filled out, it is critical that it be given for safekeeping to a family member, clergy person, doctor or other person who could be easily reached in the event of an emergency.
