

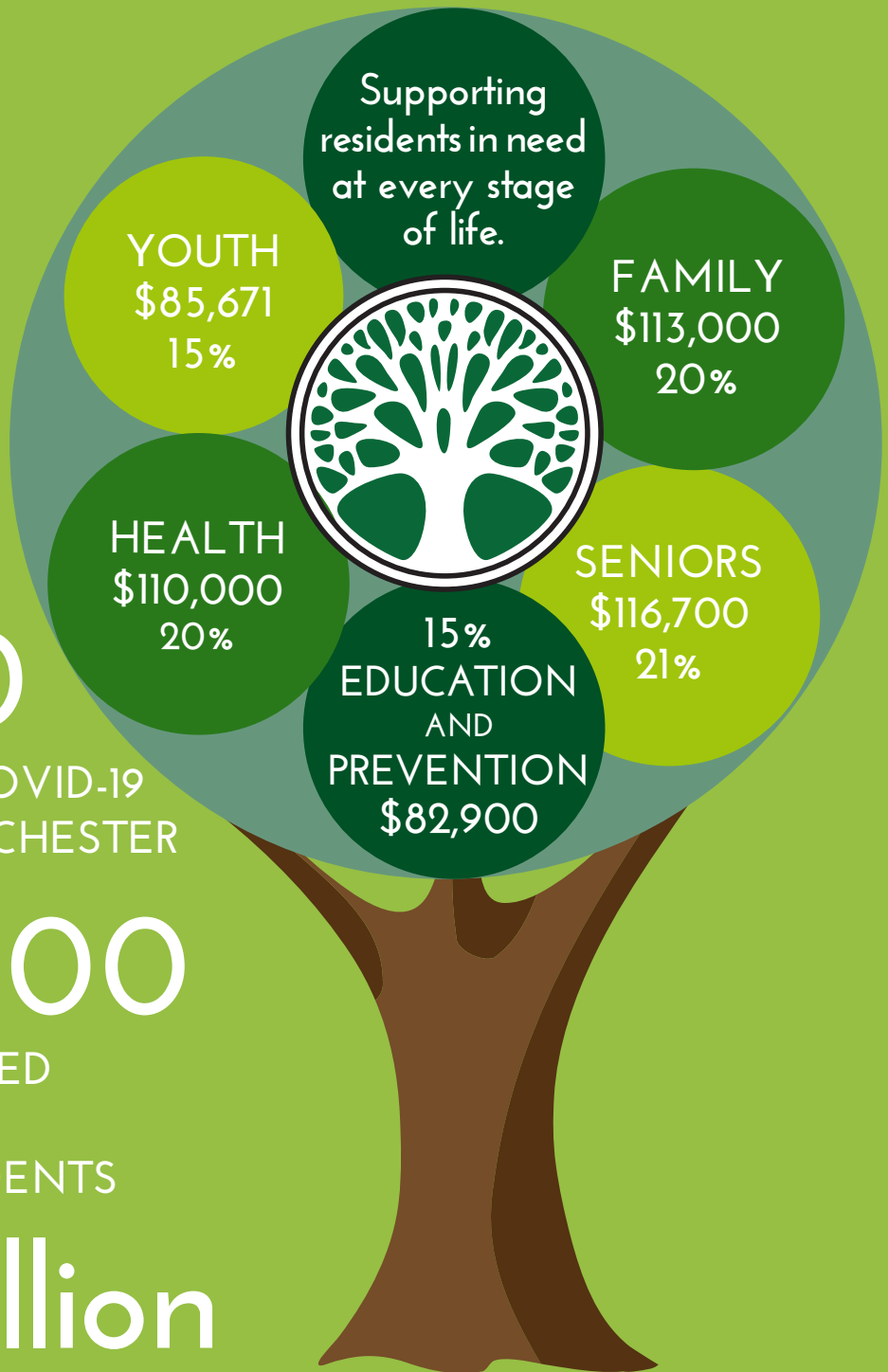
Mission

Community Conversations and Events

The Community Fund believes in connecting local residents and creating positive impact in our home community. Not only do we support local nonprofit organizations, but we see many opportunities to work with those agencies and help curate programming that provides relevant education and services to our neighbors. Partnerships with local nonprofits, PTA's and youth organizations help us ensure that we are reaching a large demographic of our residents. These events demonstrate how our resources can be allocated in new ways to help bring all three communities together.

The Community Conversation Speaker Series was created to keep the communities of Bronxville, Eastchester and Tuckahoe up-to-date on the biggest issues facing its residents today through best in class information by leading experts in the field. By joining forces as a community and having one conversation about how to deal with issues such as teen substance abuse, anxiety and pressure, we will be creating a stronger support system for our youth.



Parenting for Prevention

On October 12th, 2020, Dr. Caroline DuPont and Dr. Robert DuPont, world renowned experts in the field of drug abuse prevention and treatment led a discussion panel focused on the brain science of addiction and why the adolescent brain is particularly vulnerable to substance abuse. Members of RyeACT coalition and their youth leader group shared their unique perspective as young people and spoke to why they believe their local outcomes have improved using a community-based coalition approach.



Chris Herren Cottage Talk

On January 7th, 2020, former NBA player and motivational speaker, Chris Herren, addressed a packed house of over 400 attendees. Since 2009, Chris Herren has spoken to over 1 million students and community members, sparking honest discussions on the topics of substance use disorder and wellness. Now ten years sober, Chris is continuing to share his story nationally with a renewed focus on prevention education and challenging audiences to rethink how we look at the disease of addiction. Chris talked about his incredible basketball career and his rise to the NBA, as well as how he lost it all due to substance abuse. He was brutally honest in talking to parents about his experiences, and how his decisions took him from realizing his dreams as an NBA player to the realities of drug addiction. The evening was made possible by a generous Community Fund grant in partnership with the PTA'S of Bronxville, Eastchester, and Tuckahoe as well as the newly formed youth coalition, Stronger Together.



2nd Annual BET 3 on 3 Basketball Tournament

The Community Fund of Bronxville, Eastchester, and Tuckahoe held its second youth basketball tournament on October 20th, 2019 at the Main Street Courts in Tuckahoe. This event was created to celebrate The Community Fund’s role in refurbishing the basketball courts and has grown into a popular tradition that brings families together across all three towns to enjoy some friendly basketball and this revitalized community recreational space. Tournament participation doubled since last year with 130 players across 6/7th grade and 8/9th grade brackets including a mix of boys and girls teams from Bronxville, Eastchester and Tuckahoe. Max Pearce, Tuckahoe native, celebrity dunker and new member of the Harlem Globetrotters, came again to show his support. Max spoke to the crowd about how much the Main Street courts have meant to him growing up and his appreciation for The Community Fund’s role in helping to renovate and bring new energy back to this important community asset.

Discretionary Grants in Action

These one-time grants give the Fund the flexibility to help support an immediate need with an agency or community program, or seed a new initiative that can dramatically impact the lives of our residents. In the last 10 years the fund has given over \$210,000 in this special funding.

Youth Community Fund of BET

The Youth Community Fund (YCFBET) brings together high school students to learn the value of philanthropy through volunteering with, and awarding grants to, local nonprofit organizations. Students organize and participate in community service and fundraising events, learning about local agencies and community needs. To help meet these local needs, YCFBET solicits and evaluates grant applications; makes recommendations for funding; and votes collectively to allocate funding to those grantees that will make the greatest impact.

With over 50 members on two different teams, YCFBET started from scratch in the Fall of 2019. Leadership members determined committees, responsibilities and began organizing volunteer opportunities. Two volunteer opportunities, The Community Fund 3 on 3 Basketball tournament and Eastchester's Santa Stop, occurred in the late

fall/early winter. YCFBET had three more volunteer opportunities planned for the spring; unfortunately, we had to cancel these events due to the outbreak of COVID-19. After a quick pivot, and while keeping a safe six feet through zoom, YCFBET was able to end the year by bestowing a \$1,000 grant to The Bereavement Center, an organization that helps youth through grief counseling.

Our official launch occurred on September 13th and we are excited to announce we have over 100 members for the 2020-2021 school year. This year we hit the ground running with several community service opportunities that occurred over the summer and several more already planned for this fall. YCF members are busy organizing more events, both virtually and in-person, for this upcoming year and are looking forward to awarding several grants in spring 2021!

Covid19 Relief Fund

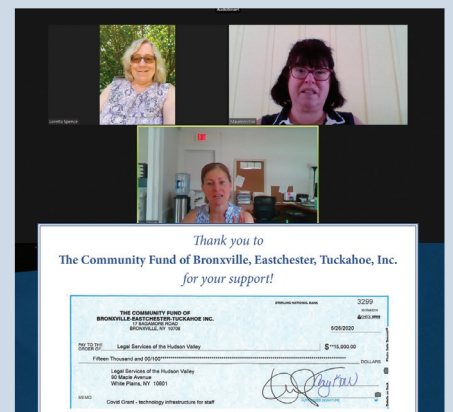
This year TCF created a new Covid19 Relief Fund to address the global Pandemic. The organization felt a pressing need to support local agencies who are providing food, medical care and shelter among other basic services to those disproportionately affected by the Coronavirus (COVID-19). With this unique fund, we were able to open our service area to our neighbors in Mount Vernon and Yonkers, offering meaningful support to those that need it most.

THE FUND DISTRIBUTED \$120,000 TO LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTING THE PEOPLE HARDEST HIT BY THE PANDEMIC IN BRONXVILLE, TUCKAHOE, EASTCHESTER, MOUNT VERNON AND YONKERS.

The Following organizations were granted funds:

- **Groundwork Hudson Valley** – funding to repurpose their educational Science Barge on the Yonkers waterfront to grow 2 to 3 acres of hard-to-find organic produce for local homeless women and a food pantry **\$15,000**
- **Aisling Irish Community Center** – funding to support meals, groceries, and mental health services for their neediest members **\$15,000**
- **Westhab** – funding to the largest provider of housing and supportive services for low income families and the homeless in Westchester County for PPE (personal protective equipment) for the housing programs and shelters they run in Mount Vernon and Yonkers **\$15,000**
- **Women's Enterprise Development Council** – funding for technology to support Spanish speaking women and minority small business owners transitioning to serving clients online **\$15,000**
- **Andrus** – funding to support the newly inaugurated Andrus Family Fund, which provides emergency aid to children and their families in times of crisis through carefully vetted disbursements **\$10,000**
- **Bundles of Joy** – funding for diapers, formula, wipes, and toiletries for low-income/homeless families of children birth to age five through food pantries, social service agencies, homeless shelters, and hospitals **\$15,000**
- **Legal Services of the Hudson Valley** – funding for a technology upgrade to support remote working for their attorneys/paralegals who provide free legal services (e.g., domestic violence, eviction/foreclosure, unemployment issues) to the neediest in our community **\$15,000**
- **Westchester Jewish Community Services** – funding to one of the largest mental health and human services agencies in Westchester for PPE (personal protective equipment) for five of their group homes for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities **\$15,000**
- **Eastchester Volunteer Ambulance Corps** – funding to help purchase PPE (personal protective equipment) **\$7,800**
- **Tuckahoe Police Department** – funding to purchase meals from local restaurants to be delivered to local seniors by the Tuckahoe Police Department **\$1,800**
- **Family Ties of Westchester** – funding for PPE (personal protective equipment) and enhanced technology to reach vulnerable clients **\$5,000**

The Covid19 Relief Fund is intended to offer immediate relief to community programs that address social, economic and other repercussions of the novel coronavirus. Designed to be flexible and nimble in order to support trusted frontline community organizations, the fund's purpose is to complement the work of local officials and expand capacity to address all aspects of the outbreak through the nonprofit sector.

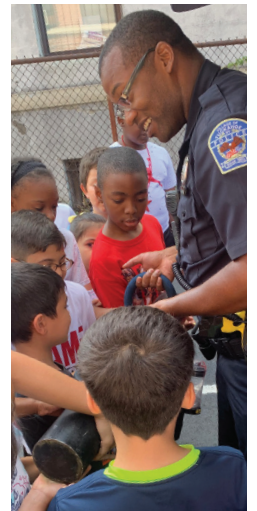


